STEP 4

Made a searching and fearless moral and financial inventory of ourselves.

May 6, 2001 was a cool Sunday Morning in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania where I found myself in a courtyard at the Radisson Hotel along with about 40 - 50 other G.A. and Gam-Anon members who were ready to have a peaceful guided meditation before the closing ceremonies of the Spring Conference.

I would later discover that moment became the beginning of my journey towards a life of recovery.

1,155 days earlier, at what I believed to be my lowest point, I walked into my first G.A. room and answered the 20 questions. Question 20 said "Have you ever

considered self-destruction or suicide as a result of your gambling?" I answered honestly with a whispered NO.

In the time between my first meeting and that fateful Sunday morning in Pittsburgh I completely abstained from gambling, went to meetings, used the telephone list and did just about everything else that my G.A. brothers and sisters suggested I do.

In spite of all that, my life was terrible. My finances weren't any better, my relationships were failing, I still had no idea what a Higher Power was and felt that my life was the worst it had ever been and held on to my belief that it could only get better from there.

Nothing could have been further from the truth. Without going into more detail about that fateful Sunday morning, I can only tell you that it was earth shattering for me. I spent the next few weeks sobbing like a child, unable to deal with the discoveries I had made about myself. It was so devastating for me that I couldn't face the realities of what I'd uncovered nor did I have anywhere to turn, or so I thought.

Back in the late 90's there wasn't much in my area in the way of sponsorship, step-working, etc. Having a basic understanding of what my illness was about, I'm pretty sure with approximately 3 years clean time under my belt, I had Step 1 down pretty good. I understood that I can't gamble normally, therefore I was different than "normal" people. Without a clear understanding of Step 2, my only way to survive was to "white knuckle" the program. They say hind sight is 20/20, but believe me when I say that there's a reason the Steps are in the order they're in. Without having a working knowledge of Step 2, there's no way to work on Step 3. Step 3 prepares us for Step 4.

My story is about what happened to me immediately following my visit to Pittsburgh.

What I discovered during that meditation was that I failed in life. I realized at that very moment that my entire life was made up of a lie. I wasn't the person I pretended to be, nor the person I claimed to be. I realized that I lived most, if not all of my life as a chameleon. Forever changing who I was in order to fit in where I was. Everybody knew me, I was always invited to the party, I was always picked to be on a team, I was a people pleaser willing to do anything for you to like me. I wanted to belong to everything only to find that I belonged to nothing.

I also realized that for years I subconsciously blamed my gambling on anything that didn't go my way. Now that the gambling was out of the equation, I had no choice, but to look at the true cause of my failures, me. A lifetime of bad decision making, lying, cheating, stealing came crashing down on me in endless waves.

3 plus years without gambling, Question 20 - have you ever considered self-destruction or suicide as a result of your gambling? No, but I'm now obsessed with trying to figure out how I'm going to kill myself as a result of not gambling. The pain of trying to cope with everything was too great for me and I needed to end the pain.

After several weeks of this unrelenting pain, I had enough. I was in my car when everything came to a head. I completely lost it, screaming uncontrollably, thrashing about in a fit of rage punching my steering wheel until my hands bled for what seemed an eternity. In reality, it had only been about 30 seconds long, culminated in the following words "I need to die, please help me" which I'm sure would have been incomprehensible at the time.

In an instant, I had been changed forever. My desire to die was gone and I felt a presence which I instinctively understood was my Higher Power. Although my work was just beginning, I knew in an instant that Step 2 and Step 3 were essentially done and I would eventually be okay.

At this time, I finally understood the answer to a question in our Combo Book which I've heard recited too many times to count, yet didn't understand the true meaning. Is it important to know why we gambled? Perhaps, however insofar as stopping gambling, many compulsive gamblers have abstained without the benefit of the knowledge of why they gambled. I always looked at this statement thinking for some it's okay and for others, not so much. The part I was failing to see was the benefit in that statement. How could I fix what I don't know to be broken? This was just yet another key to unlocking the door towards recovery.

For the next year or so I was able to slowly deal with all the baggage I had built up over a lifetime. I was able to do so systematically knowing I had the help of my Higher Power. The tears were many and at times the sleeping was non-existent, but what shocked me the most about taking a moral inventory of myself, was the feeling of being cleansed. The more that came out, the better I felt. The deeper I got, the more honest I became until slowly, things stopped surfacing, I stopped looking, and my life was truly turning around. My relationships were getting better, for the first time in my life, I had a relationship with my Higher Power and strangely, my finances started to improve.

Through the years I have worked Step 4 several times. A few weeks ago in my homeroom meeting, our topic was to pick a moment where our moral fiber was tested during our time in action where the result was failure. To my surprise, something new surfaced that was such a big part of my life, but until this moment, I was never able to see.

There was an entirely different side of that chameleon that I was many years ago. Putting aside my own insecurities, there were people that were drawn to me.

The disturbing truth that I discovered that night and shared with my group was that in many cases, not all, how close I allowed someone to get to me greatly depended on what I needed or could get out of them. Looking back, this behavior tied in perfectly with my feelings of not belonging. I used people to up my “status” or “better my chances with x, y and z”.

Thanks to this program and with the help of my brothers, sisters and my Higher Power, discoveries about myself no longer cripple me. The tools of this fellowship have taught me to understand the person I was in the throes of my addiction and the person I am now in recovery. I now know when to leave something in the past or when to bring it back for the sake of making amends.

Step 4 gave me things I never knew existed. It gave me the freedom to live, the freedom to choose, the freedom to say yes and the freedom to say no. It gave me the ability to feel empathy towards others. It gave me the ability to accept who I was and who I was not. It gave me the ability to love unconditionally now that I was able to love myself.

I’m grateful to my room for having “deep” topics such as this that allow me to try and better myself continuously.
