STEP 2

Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

In order to maintain group unity, we individually serve Gamblers Anonymous with the authority granted to us by the group. The "Group Conscience" gives us the framework of our "authority". We are not elected to command, order, demand, change, or alter the program, we simply service and express the opinions that have been determined by the "Group Conscience".

So, the leadership positions that exist within Gamblers Anonymous present us with a two edged sword. The group is responsible to elect people who will represent the will of the group, and the individual elected to represent the group has to remember that he or she acts only with the explicit authority granted to them by the "Group Conscience".

My own ego contributed greatly to the behavior that got me to Gamblers Anonymous. I find it is very difficult to accept the fact that I serve not as a leader in the sense that I can make new rules and alter old customs, but as trusted servant who only serves to follow out the will of the group. The word trusted, not one that I ever could have used when my name came up before joining Gamblers Anonymous, is the key word. I am trusted by my fellow members to carry out their will.

The group, through their own individual Higher Powers, decides what is best for the group and Gamblers Anonymous as a whole. Being a trusted servant is a humbling experience, because we have to follow the dictates of the "Group Conscience" and not our own ego.

The symmetry of the two entities, the group and the trusted servant, when working properly insures the continuity of the program. We have to keep the Gamblers Anonymous Fellowship in the same condition as we found it, so that the new members find the same nurturing experience that we have all had.

From Your International Executive Secretary

As we are putting this month's issue of the bulletin together, I would like to once again say ***"thanks"*** to all of the members, groups and Intergroups who have continued their support of the International Service Office. And to ask those of you who might have unintentionally forgotten about ***your*** International Service Office to please read the following:

We are often asked what does the International Service Office do? And how does Gamblers Anonymous get their money? For the past several years in the February issue of the bulletin we have included "How the I.S.O. Receives Its Money" and "What the I.S.O. Does". If you have previously read this, I would offer this as a reminder that we are still carrying the message and thank you in advance for reading it again.

"WHAT THE I.S.O. DOES"

- Answers telephones, e-mails and all other correspondence received.
- Sorts and distributes daily mail received.
- Updates and maintains the Gamblers Anonymous International Directory on our website.
- Processes receipts for all donations, Lifeliners, Cans, Groups, etc.
- Maintains ledgers for all money received through QuickBooks and keeps a Confidential ledger for individual Lifeliners.
- Processes receipts for all accounts receivables and literature orders.
- Processes orders; received by mail, fax and from our on-line store.
- Prepares and sends Starter Kits to those requesting them and keeps the Trustees informed of when and where meeting kits are going.
- Sends "Information Packets" with a letter about Gamblers Anonymous to the many people requesting information on our Program.

- Sends pertinent information to Trustees, Regents and membership as needed.
- Keeps an inventory of literature on hand.
- Orders and inventories all Office Supplies.
- Prepares ending monthly Accounts Receivables Report for Intergroups and sends invoice copies that are due to be paid.
- Balances ledgers to deposits and makes weekly bank deposits.
- Prepares monthly Operating Statement and does complete accounting procedures for the Office.
- Keeps track of all accounts payable and processes the checks for bills that are signed by two of three mandatory signatures of the Board of Regents.
- Compiles, enters, and proof reads all letters, donations, anniversaries, etc. for Life-Line Bulletin on a continuing basis.
- Constantly updating and reprinting (or upon approval by the Board of Trustees) printing new literature.

HOW THE I.S.O. RECEIVES ITS MONEY

LIFELINERS - (Not to be confused with Life-Line Bulletin Subscription) A Lifeline is an individual donation from a member on a monthly basis. You can pledge any amount you wish. It is a personal thing and only you and the International Service Office know the amount you give. If you are interested, the form to fill out is on the back cover of this bulletin.

CAN CONTRIBUTIONS - A Can contribution is a direct donation to the I.S.O. Groups pass around a can at their meeting and then send a check or money order once a month totaling the amount collected. If you do not have a Can or Can number, and would like one please let us know and we will see that you get one.

GROUP CONTRIBUTIONS - A Group contribution is what is donated to the I.S.O. from the groups after they have met all of their expenses; such as rent, coffee, literature, etc.

INTERGROUP CONTRIBUTIONS - An Intergroup contribution is what each individual Intergroup has decided amongst themselves to donate to the I.S.O.

LIFE-LINE BULLETIN SUBSCRIPTIONS - (Not to be confused with Lifeliners) A Bulletin subscription is when a member or group subscribes on a yearly basis to receive the Life-Line Bulletin by First-Class mail. The order form is on the second page of this issue for those of you are reading this online, and on the front inside cover of this issue, for those of you who are already subscribers and reading your subscription copy.

ONE-TIME DONATIONS - A One-Time donation can be one of many different ways to give to the I.S.O. It is with deep regret that I'm writing about two of our dear brothers in our fellowship who have recently passed away.

Norman W., who passed away on December 17, 2017 had just celebrated 53 years of abstinence from gambling on November 24, 2017. Norman would have been 89 years old in March. When Norman entered Gamblers Anonymous in November 1964 he took to the program immediately. He said "I will do whatever G.A. tells me to do. My way did not work".

Norman handled our Pressure Group Meetings in New Jersey and was very active in our Intergroup meetings. He worked on our National G.A. Conference in New Jersey in 1967.
