***Note From I.S.O.:** It always amazes me how my Higher Power works.....Last week, as the January issue of the Life-Liner bulletin was in its final stages and since it was time for the Recovery Steps for the corresponding months I was thinking of what to include. Since I hadn't asked anyone to share their experiences with us I just included the explanation of Step 1 from the Red Book, “A New Beginning” which was in January's Life-Liner in 2015.*

Today is the day that all corrections are being done and we are preparing to send the final draft to our formatter. I was reviewing my emails that were received over the weekend and saw one with the subject line “I.S.O. Bulletin Submission”. After reading it, I immediately knew that I had to replace the original with this one.

I hope you all enjoy reading it as much as I did. Thank you, Steve F. for your wonderful timing.

STEP 1

We admitted we were powerless over gambling—that our lives had become unmanageable.

Every Journey Begins with the First Step

I was first introduced to G.A. in August of 2002, and remember that first meeting in Beverly Hills at Roxbury Park. Those uncontrollable thoughts of sitting in the parking lot before going in, fighting with that “voice” in my head saying that I really wasn't that bad. I can remember like it was yesterday, and hope that I never forget those feelings. There were “old timers”, who stayed after the meeting and talked to me in the parking lot, answering questions that I was too afraid to ask in a group setting and people inviting me to another meeting. I'm so grateful looking back, that they made themselves available to me and made me feel so welcome.

When I was new, I went to 5-6 meetings per week. G.A. was my life, and that's all I knew, and what kept me free from gambling. Someone told me to bring cookies to the Santa Monica Friday meeting, so I showed up and brought cookies. Another person invited me out to fellowship after the meeting at a coffee shop, and I showed up and shared a meal. Someone asked me to chair a meeting, and I accepted. The more I got involved, the better my life was, not just financially, but also in my relationships with family and work. I was changing. I remember attending a 1 year anniversary and asked the person celebrating, "What do you get for your birthday"? He replied so humbly....."you get your life back". I can still hear those words today, when I attend celebrations in the program. Such a unique concept, but it doesn't come without a little bit of effort on my part.

I got involved by being a secretary at the meeting level, and then secretary at L.A. Intergroup. I watched what others were doing, and wanted what they had, so I did what they did. My life continued to get better until one day, I stopped going to meetings because I was "too busy" and didn't have the time. The truth was, I wasn't really working a program, and ultimately stopped calling my sponsor. I began to get upset at meetings at things that were out of my control. I found myself isolating, with no "safe" place to go. Almost all of my "regular" meetings were off limits because of some altercation, mostly happening inside my head. When people would call me, I'd let it go to voice mail. I began separating myself from the groups, and justified my actions, with no one to be accountable to. This was in early 2005, with over 3 years in the program. In September of 2005, after a bad day at work, I decided to go see about playing bingo in a neighboring city. I had been there before and told myself that if I could find the bingo hall, I would play, otherwise, I'd go home. At the time, I was the treasurer of a G.A. meeting. It didn't matter, 6 hours later, and over \$400 dollars gone, I had returned to gambling, and lost over 1100 days of abstinence. I found myself driving about 80mph on the freeway, frantically trying to get home, my mind consumed only about myself. Luckily, I knew enough to call a friend. It was after midnight, with a shaky and almost unrecognizable voice, that I asked him to meet me at Norms Restaurant in West LA. Such a lonely feeling that night, but one that I don't ever want to forget. I was so broken with shame and guilt, yet I was determined to pick myself up and ask for help. We talked until 2:30 in the morning. This is what G.A. had taught me. The hardest thing to do is showing up, after that, you never know what can happen. The very next night, I showed up at a Culver City meeting and said I have 1 day, with tears in my eyes. I showed up at an International conference a few days later in San Diego with 12 days. This was my new beginning, my new journey.

I came back to G.A. on September 27, 2005, and while I didn't really know what to expect, I was willing to go to any length. My recovery journey was now on a different path, even though it was still the same program. I remember showing up to the meeting where I had been the treasurer and coming clean about my relapse. Knowing and understanding the value of being of service, I

desperately wanted something to keep me connected and asked, with only a few days clean, to be the Literature Person. The answer was an emphatic NO, because I didn't have enough clean time to hold that position. The trust and responsibility that I had built up in 3 years was gone, just like that. It's a very humbling feeling to not be able to be of service, when I had in the past. However, knowing that I had to work towards something, made it more valuable; something to strive for, that I could earn by not gambling. It was like getting a 30 day key chain, and so I kept coming back. One day became two, two became three, and I continued putting one foot in front of the other.

I am forever grateful for a few members who, when I had less than 6 months back in the program, entrusted me to organize a mini conference and taught me how to work with the hotels. This was a turning point for me, which gave me self-esteem and self-confidence. As a direct result, I was able to organize more mini conferences, and even put together an international conference. It opened up doors for me to become a Trustee of Area 1, where I had the opportunity to learn more about G.A. In 2008, I attended my first out of state conference in Houston. I met people from all over the world, who are still a part of my life today, including my wife. Back then, we were just friends, fellow trustees from different states. I found myself in a workshop entitled, "Camp G.A.", in which I had no business being in, since it was a creative workshop, and I was not "creative", at least in that way. However, I learned something in that workshop so valuable, that I continue to use today, which is, "everything seems impossible for the person who won't try anything". Wow, so powerful!

I learned the value and responsibility of being on the Board of Regents, and the business side of how G.A. works on a daily basis, servicing the world! While serving on the Board of Regents, someone nominated me for Chairman. There was no way that I could handle that position, or so my head told me so. Then I thought of the slogan that I heard in Houston in 2008.....Hmmm.....Ok, I'll try. The trying lasted for 2 years!

I think about where I am today on my recovery journey. It's a new path, one that I haven't finished traveling, with lots of places yet to see, and people yet to meet. I try and think of all the people who have helped me along the way, before and after my relapse. They all have a place in my heart and help define who I am today. Each of them, had a very instrumental effect on me and my journey, and as a visual way of looking back, they are the "web" of my life, interwoven, and the strength that keeps me together. Many of them are still connected to me today, as I abstain from gambling, one day at a time.

As I reflect back, there have been so many blessings. I'm truly grateful for my life today and being free from gambling for over 13 years. My life today is nowhere near perfect, but it's a whole lot better than it used to be. I've experienced losing my job and not having a place to live, to having the job of my

dreams and owning my own home. Traveling, sporting events, wedding celebrations and funerals, are all part of my journey today, but the one constant that has always been there, is G.A. My past is truly my greatest asset, remembering how it was, and what happened along the way to change me.

Remember, **Every Journey Begins with the First Step.** Thank you for allowing me to share mine with you.
