## TWELVE STEPS OF UNITY

**Unity** – Something that is complete within itself, with a oneness of purpose of thought and spirit.

For the compulsive gambler who walks through the door, out of a want and need to stop gambling, and with a desire to become a member of Gamblers Anonymous, it often seems to be a tremendous task simply to stop gambling and restore oneself to a normal way of thinking and living. In the beginning there is an understanding confusion of the mind and the normal impatience. We try to open our minds to share with others who have experienced the first steps of recovery.

The new member often blocks out any discussion of the Unity Program for a period of time, and even those members who have abstained from gambling for longer periods often avoid or put aside the need for discussion and the acceptance of the Unity Program for any number of reasons, but the truth of the matter is the great need for an understanding of the progress of our recovery, made possible by the tools that are available to us as contained in the Steps of Unity.

The Gamblers Anonymous Unity Program is a framework for the well-being of individual groups and the Fellowship as a whole. The Unity Program is outlined in Twelve Steps and is meant to insure the continuity and perpetuity of Gamblers Anonymous.

In order to maintain the Fellowship for present and future members, both individuals and groups follow the proven concepts upon which the Unity Program is based. The essence of this program is in the preservation of common welfare, members understand that what is best for the group is best for each individual.

The Unity Program serves to protect the Fellowship from disruption. Members work together under the principles of unity in order to preserve and perpetuate the opportunity for themselves and other compulsive gamblers to recover and grow within the Fellowship.

## **STEP 1**

**Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon group unity.**

Our common welfare is based upon the desire to stop gambling and to solve our common problem. Personal recovery depends upon this common goal. When one maintains abstinence from gambling, we improve our quality of life. We then see that our common good is primary as we recover individually in unity with each other. A group that is troubled due to personality conflicts, indifference to each others, individual ambitions, super egos, compulsive talkers, disruptive members and others who openly indicate that group unity is not essential, will certainly be unable to carry our message, and in time the group will cease effectively to exist.

Gambling can shatter and perhaps destroy the gambler but an individual who gambles cannot destroy the Group. In the early days, we wondered if the Group could survive the many individual relapses. Today, we know the Group will survive.

My name is Bob W. and I have known Bernie since he came to Gamblers Anonymous over 12 years ago. Bernie was one of those rare individuals that got involved in the program almost immediately. He became a meeting secretary after about 60 days and became involved on an International level after the required 2 years. He spent 7 years on the Board of Regents which is the Board of Directors of Gamblers Anonymous. Bernie was the most organized G.A. member I have ever seen. Everything was put into folders and notebooks with all important documents laminated. Thereby Bernie was dubbed Bernie the Laminator. Bernie was always there when you needed him for anything.

Bernie was very proud of his years in the Marines. He was a helicopter pilot in Vietnam and was awarded the Purple Heart for an injury. He was very involved in the annual reunions of his squadron. Bernie was the true definition of the Marines Semper Fi. He was always loyal and always faithful.

Bernie had 4 grandsons and was very proud of all of them. On occasion he would take them to the movies. If they wanted to see animated cartoon movies, that was ok with Bernie. He just loved spending time with them.

Bernie drove his car just like he was flying a helicopter. He never paid attention to the double lines. He would go in and out of the car pool lanes just like the lines were not there. He also had a tendency to tailgate. Most people refused to ride with Bernie but I never had a problem. When he got too close to the car in front of him I would just say, Bernie remember 1 car length for each 10 MPH and he would back off. For a number of years I had problems driving on the freeway. Bernie was always there when I needed him. When my brother Lou turned 70 he threw himself a birthday party at the Universal Hilton Buffet. I just said Bernie I want to go to my brother's birthday party at the Universal City Hilton Buffet and Bernie was in. He also took me to my Brother Ben's 80<sup>th</sup> birthday party at his country club buffet. Yes, Bernie loved buffets. We had dinner together at least twice a week. I would say "Bernie where would you like to eat". His response was always you know me Bob I can eat anywhere.

I will dearly miss Bernie. He was an asset to G.A. and very involved in the I.E.S.H.C. a location where 12 step meetings are held. At the meetings he always sat in the same seat at the end of the table. If anyone sat in Bernie's seat someone would say "that's Bernie's seat". The I.E.S.H.C. had fund raisers to keep the doors opened. Bernie was always there to help and always donated items to sell. One day a garage sale was held and Bernie showed up with about 15 deep sea fishing rods and reels plus all kinds of lures. Needless to say these sold really well and raised lots of money.

Bernie was born into an Italian Catholic family, adopted by an Orthodox Jewish family and here we are celebrating his life in a Protestant Church. He was a good giving man and lived a wonderful life. He was a Husband, Father, Grandfather, Great grandfather and a good friend.
