Current version: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

Proposed version: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For Board members residing within 200 miles, telephonic or video conferencing will constitute presence, Under special circumstances (Bold) if approved by a majority of the Board members in physical attendance. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

Gamblers Anonymous ought never endorse, finance or lend the Gamblers Anonymous name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

As our literature teaches us, our primary purpose is to stop gambling, and to help other compulsive gamblers do the same. We do this by understanding, interpreting and implementing, to the best of our ability, the Gamblers Anonymous Recovery Program.

This particular Unity Step cautions us not to become related to, or endorse the activities of, any outside enterprise; no matter how noble the cause, nor how altruistic the motives of those involved. As legalized gambling becomes more a part of the fabric of our society, many groups and organizations are being created to identify and deal with the problem of compulsive gambling. As compulsive gamblers who have suffered horribly in the past, our hearts necessarily are deeply touched by such efforts.

Many of us in the Gamblers Anonymous fellowship will have a strong desire to become involved in such outside enterprises, however we ought to be ever vigilant against allowing our actions, or those of other G.A. members, to come into conflict with the unity principles of this fellowship. If we choose to attempt to wear two hats, we must remember to take one hat off before putting on our other hat.

This program works because of the common ground that we share, and the experience, strength and hope we can offer to each other through the individual G.A. rooms in which we alone can enter. Our unique expertise we bring to the problem of compulsive gambling, currently referred to in society as the “been there - done that” education, needs to be protected and shielded from the potential problems of money, property and prestige.

I always find it a bit disappointing when I send you money every few months and it loses so much weight in the conversion process. However, I'm sure you will accept whatever we send with gratitude, and we trust that whatever we are able to send helps to further the good work that your office does for all of us "out there".

Now for our news:

Our Nanaimo group celebrated 20 years last week! We had two cakes and every chair was filled as we commemorated this great milestone. Anne K. began the Group on her own 20 years ago and spent many nights by herself reading the G.A. material and waiting for company. Gradually she was joined by more and more people seeking help for their gambling addiction. Harry S. soon showed up to join her and he is still active with the group, as are several of the original members. I wish I had all the log books from those years to count how many people actually came through the door to join Anne and the others, but I think it would be safe to say that hundreds have attended over the last two decades. Some stayed, some drifted in and out, and some were from out of town and attending their very first G.A. meeting while receiving addiction treatment nearby. Our hope is that everyone who sat at our table got something that they could take away with them, even if we never saw them again.

Today we have a strong and supportive group with 12 -15 regulars every week, and often lately we've had to go find extra chairs because so many people have showed up. That's always a happy problem to have! Every meeting is a warm and friendly experience with more laughter than tears, and a true feeling of family. We not only meet for our regular Tuesday meeting, but we get together for dinner before the meeting, and some golf together, go to movies or walk together, and we've even been out bowling together. At our 20-year celebration we tried to communicate to Anne our deep and sincere gratitude and our admiration for what she did for all of us. If she hadn't been willing to commit to being at the meeting every single week in the beginning, none of us would have had a group to turn to when we hit bottom and reached out for help. Anne and her husband even stopped travelling for two years until there were enough regulars in the group to take over the meetings when they were away. That's commitment!

From this solid home group, one of our members has now begun another meeting in nearly Parksville, which we hope will have the same success and longevity. Another member is now a very active part of the British Columbia

Intergroup, which helps connect us to G.A. members, in the rest of the province and Alaska. Jon C.'s work as part of the Public Relations Committee will hopefully bring the miracle of G.A. to even more of those who need the genuine recovery and life-long transformation that this program can bring.

I also want to thank you, I.S.O. for being there when Anne needed you, and for continuing to be there to support those of us who have come after and for every future G.A. member, wherever they live.

2. Log on to Amazon.com to create an Amazon account and payment method using the same e-mail address as your Kindle account.
3. On the Amazon home page, in the upper left-hand corner, tap or left click on [Departments](#). Scroll down and tap or left click on [Books & Audible](#). In the column to the right, tap or left click on [Kindle Books](#). In the search box enter [Combo Book](#). Scroll down to locate the book, tap or left click on the book. Tap or left click on [Purchase](#). The book will automatically download to your device.

Instructions for Nook purchase:

1. Download a Nook app for Apple products (iPhone or iPad), from the [App Store](#). For Android phones, Microsoft Windows tablets or PC, log on to an Internet search engine and download [Google Play Store](#).
2. After you have the app for your device or computer create an account with an e-mail address and password. If you already have a Barnes & Noble or Google Play account use the same e-mail on your device or computer. If you already have a Barnes and Noble account, go to Step 4.
3. Log on to BN.com to create Barnes & Noble account and payment method for your iPhone, Android, iPad, tablet, PC or Mac computer using the same e-mail address as your Nook account.
4. On the Barnes & Noble home page, in the upper left-hand corner, tap or left click on [Nook Books](#). In the column on the left, tap or left click on [Nook Books under \\$2.99](#). In the search box type [Combo Book](#), scroll thru books to locate a picture of the book cover, tap or left click the book. Tap or left click on [Purchase](#). The book will automatically download to your device.
