- B. **MP3 RECORDINGS/AUDIO LITERATURE.**  
Recommendation from Andrew, our Web designer was to use I-Tunes as a platform for Audio literature instead of MP3s. This can be automated and linked to the Gamblers Anonymous website. Paperwork will have to be submitted. John C. will be liaison with I-Tunes.
- C. **COMPLIANCE AUDIT.**  
All requested items have been completed and will be sent to our attorney for review by Tuesday, February 20<sup>th</sup>. The goal is to have a report at the Cancun Trustee meeting.
- D. **6 MONTH FINANCIAL REPORT.**  
This was prepared by John C. and reviewed by entire Board.
- E. **UPDATE ON I.S.O. EMPLOYEE.**  
The part time employee who was hired August 1, 2017 has been terminated for cause. A Worker's Compensation claim that had been filed in January 2018 was denied and an appeal is pending. Insurance is handling this. All Board members have been updated.

We have hired a Certified Pro Advisor in QuickBooks, who will be working at the Office Monday, Wednesday and Friday for 15 to 20 hours per week.

### **3. NEW BUSINESS**

- A. **DISCUSS BY-LAW CHANGES**  
John C. presented two by-law changes. He requested a straw vote from the Board before having these put on the Cancun Trustee Agenda. The majority of the Board was in favor.

They are as follows:

By-laws Article III- Directors

Add "...under special circumstances..."

Current version Section 6: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

Proposed version Section 6: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For Board members residing within 200 miles, telephonic or video conferencing will constitute presence, Under special circumstances (Bold) if approved by a majority of the Board members in physical attendance. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

Add "...under special circumstances..."

Current Version: Section 7: A Regent is automatically removed from office on missing two (2) consecutive regular board meetings or when any Regent has missed four (4) regular meetings during their two (2) year term inclusive of the mandatory June meeting immediately following the election of the Board of Regents, or for not maintaining regular attendance at G.A. meetings as prescribed by the Guidance Code.

Proposed Version: Section 7: A Regent is automatically removed from office on missing two (2) consecutive regular board meetings or when any Regent has missed four (4) regular meetings during their two (2) year term inclusive of the mandatory June meeting immediately following the election of the Board of Regents, or for not maintaining regular attendance at G.A. meetings as prescribed by the Guidance Code. Under special circumstances (BOLD) absence from a Board meeting may be excused by a majority.

## B. LINKS TO PHONE MEETING.

There is some concern that a non-sanctioned phone meeting called World Wide 12 Step Phone Meeting was using the Gamblers Anonymous name improperly. Bob W. will contact the person who is in charge of this meeting and ask him to make the necessary changes.

The collection in the amount of \$50.00 was taken and the meeting closed with the Serenity Prayer at 10:36 A.M. The next meeting of the Board of Regents will be held on March 17, 2017 at 9:30 A.M.

Today's Board of Regents meeting had 5 people call in and listen.

Right after the close of today's meeting, it was determined that a very important item had been omitted. Since all members in attendance were still present, the three people who were on the phone were contacted and the following item was presented.

**FALL 2018 TRUSTEE MEETING.**

Bob W. has received a contract for the Fall 2018 Trustee meeting which is to be held in Orlando, Florida October 14 and 15, 2018 at the Caribe Royale Orlando. The Board reviewed the contract. A motion was made to approve contract for signature as presented.

What a nice surprise when after only two weeks of abstinence I was invited by some “oldtimes” to Sunday breakfast. I felt so good. How could such a small gesture make me feel so much a part of the fellowship? Finally, I had come home!

This feeling lasted right up until the time I pulled up a chair and was asked the question, “So, what did it feel like when you hit your bottom?”

I don't remember my response but I'll never forget the pressure it created by that question. Never mind that I had enough pain to consider suicide before this program, but I was sure it needed to be even worse than that to be considered for membership.

My fragile ego told me I'd better come up with a good answer or I might not be able to stay in the program. There was so much stuff going on in my head at that moment. I didn't know whether to run, cry or make up the story of the century.

Did our founders have me in mind when they reduced the common denominator so there could never be a mistake as to who did or did not qualify for membership in Gamblers Anonymous? This step leaves no room for error. It doesn't ask us to think, feel, challenge, take issue, prequalify, form committees or do anything at all. I like that.

Today when I greet newcomers I only ask them if they want to quit gambling. No need to say anything else...unless you want to welcome them home.

## GROUP NEWS

*Note From I.S.O.:*

*The following letter is being reprinted from the August 2016 LifeLine Bulletin as a reminder about "getting involved and being of service".*

Karen,

Get involved and be of service has proven to be the cornerstone of my recovery. The more involved I got, the more connected I became which has led me down a path of a freedom I never imagined possible.

In the beginning, I struggled in Gamblers Anonymous. My struggles were not relapse related, they were more of what I like to refer to as collapse related.

Once the bet was gone, what was left? Everything I had been running from, hiding from and avoiding for my entire life would now come crashing down on me with no barrier to hide behind.

The world as I knew it changed with just 5 words "I am a compulsive gambler". Soon after saying these words my world started imploding on me. I soon came to realize that everything I thought I knew about myself was a lie. In my head I was, let's be honest, semi faithful to my religion. In reality, I had no spirituality. In my head I had a million friends who would do anything for me. In reality, I was alone. In my head my marriage was being held together by a shoe string. In reality my wife is the strongest person I've ever known.

There was very little if any sponsorship in my area at that time. I'll refer the first few years in the program as white knuckling it. I wasn't working the program or so I thought in the traditional sense only because I didn't know how.

I'm about 6 months in when someone in the room says to me, "I can't be here next week, would you mind opening up the room, setting everything up and make the coffee?". For some odd reason, I said sure, no problem.

The following week, I asked the secretary of the room what should I do with the key? He said hold on to it until next week and give it back to name unknown. Hesitantly, I said OK, although I was not happy about it. It really tapped into my feeling sorry for myself time.

The following week came and name unknown was no where to be found. Two more weeks and name unknown finally comes back around 10 minutes after the meeting started, "My name is and I placed my last bet yesterday". The words he stated felt like trumpets blasting throughout my body. In his share, he made it very clear that he knew he was going back to the bet when he handed me that key.

It's pretty obvious to me now that subconsciously I related the lack of service to relapse. It's only recently that I became aware of this feeling of mine while talking to a G.A. brother. He said to me that being of service in our fellowship is what gives him the will, desire and fight to continue on this journey of recovery.

It is through service to our fellowship that gives me my freedom. Freedom to practice MY spiritual beliefs, freedom to face the REAL me, freedom from my past, freedom to look at my future, freedom to work my steps, freedom to be open minded, freedom to not be afraid, freedom to learn and freedom to recover.

I now have an additional 6 words that continue to mold my life. These 6 words can be found on page 17 of our Combo Book "Get involved and be of service". My service in the fellowship has been continual in one way or another ever since I took those keys some 18 years ago.

Remember, there is no job too big or too small, they all need to get done. Share the load, share the recovery.
