Based upon the review of relevant documents provided by G.A.I.S.O. or obtained from government agency websites and, as of the date of this letter, Gamblers Anonymous is in compliance with its filing obligations with the Internal Revenue Service and the California Franchise Tax Board, Secretary of State and Registry of Charitable Trusts.

D PRESSURE RELIEF PAMPHLETS.

All Board members have reviewed the attorneys recommendations for the Pressure Relief Pamphlet and Flyer. A motion was made that the Board of Regents would follow all recommendations that the attorney has submitted.

3. A. REVIEW BOARD OF TRUSTEES AGENDA.

The following items from the Board of Trustee Agenda were discussed:

40. Discussion Item

Would it be both beneficial and cost-effective for Gamblers Anonymous to add GPS functionality to its website so that new members and members in crisis could click the “US Meetings” link without adding additional information and a map of meetings would

come up on the caller's mobile phone based on its location? This is a technology most businesses are already using.

This item was discussed by Board members but not voted on.

44. By-Laws – Article III – Section 6 – Directors

Add "...under special circumstances..."

Current version: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

Proposed version: Five (5) members of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Regents does not acknowledge proxies in any form. If a Board member resides within 200 miles from the International Service Office, physical attendance constitutes presence. For Board members residing within 200 miles, telephonic or video conferencing will constitute presence, Under special circumstances (**Bold**) if approved by a majority of the Board members in physical attendance. For those residing outside of 200 miles a physical, telephonic or video conferencing attendance constitutes presence. A maximum of four (4) Regents residing outside of 200 miles of the International Service Office who do not physically attend meetings can be seated at one time.

45. By-Laws – Article III – Section 7 – Directors

Add "...under special circumstances..."

Current Version: A Regent is automatically removed from office on missing two (2) consecutive regular board meetings or when any Regent has missed four (4) regular meetings during their two (2) year term inclusive of the mandatory June meeting immediately following the election of the Board of Regents, or for not maintaining regular attendance at G.A. meetings as prescribed by the Guidance Code.

Proposed Version: A Regent is automatically removed from office on missing two (2) consecutive regular board meetings or when any Regent has missed four (4) regular meetings during their two (2) year term inclusive of the mandatory June meeting immediately following the election of the Board of Regents, or for not maintaining regular attendance at G.A. meetings as prescribed by the Guidance Code. Under special circumstances (BOLD) absence from a Board meeting may be excused by a majority vote of the Board members in attendance.

46. Article VI – Voting – Section 2 – 1st Sentence

Replace the word conference with Board of Trustees Meeting

Current version: The Board of Regents of this Corporation shall be elected every two (2) years by the Board of Trustees at the Spring Conference. The term of office shall be for a period of two (2) years commencing July 1 of the odd years and ending June 30 of the next odd year.

Proposed version: The Board of Regents of this Corporation shall be elected every two (2) years by the Board of Trustees at the Spring Board of Trustees Meeting. The term of office shall be for a period of two (2) years commencing July 1 of the odd years and ending June 30 of the next odd year.

47. By-Laws – Article VI – Voting – Section 6 – 1st Section

Replace the word Conference with Board of Trustees Meeting

Current version: Sealed ballots will remain unopened in the “BALLOT” envelope, and will be handed to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees during the first session of the Trustee meeting of the Spring Conference.

Proposed version: Sealed ballots will remain unopened in the “BALLOT” envelope, and will be handed to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees during the first session of the Trustee meeting of the Spring Board of Trustees Meeting.

60. Guidance Code – Article XX – Amendments – Section V

Replace entire paragraph

Current Version: The Guidance Code shall be reprinted, at least every other year, if any change has been made. Copies shall be sent to all Gamblers Anonymous groups, each member of the Board of Trustees and each member of the Board of Regents.

Proposed Version: The Guidance Code shall never be printed. Copies of the Guidance Code shall be sent to all Gamblers Anonymous groups, each member of the Board of Trustees and each member of the Board of Regents every 2 years unless no changes have been made.

The Board is in agreement with items 44, 45, 46, 47 and 60.

B. APPROVE EXPENSE FOR CHAIR TO ATTEND THE CANCUN BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEETING.

Motion was made to approve \$1,200.00 for Chairman expenses for the Cancun Board of Trustee Meeting.

STEP 5

Gamblers Anonymous has but one primary purpose - to carry its message to the compulsive gambler who still suffers

There are many popular slogans that sum up this important Unity Step: "We can't be all things to all people." "It's better to do one thing well, than many things poorly." "Stick to what you know."

One example of this is our societies' continued obsession with legalized gambling. As our governments continue to authorize additional casinos and lotteries to cure their ailing budgets, the temptation for those of us in G.A. is to jump on our soap box and shout to the heavens about the evils of gambling. But we don't. We don't because our Unity Program tells us not to. As members of Gamblers Anonymous, these outside activities are of no interest to us. We are only concerned with the compulsive gambler who is still suffering. We have only one primary purpose and that is to carry the G.A. message to those who don't know there is a way out of their insanity.

We as members of Gamblers Anonymous have the unique ability to be able to help the problem gambler when others seldom can. It matters not how educated we are, how much money we have or what our occupation is. The only thing that matters is that we are compulsive gamblers who have found a way to stop gambling. Our experiences of suffering and of recovery are easily passed among our members; one to the other. This is our gift, the ability to carry our message to the suffering gambler.

As we come to realize that we do indeed have this gift, we soon recognize that as with all gifts, we must give this gift to others. If I somehow discovered the cure to the AIDS virus, would I not be compelled to share this discovery? The same is true in Gamblers Anonymous. If through this Fellowship I have found a way to arrest my gambling and I choose to keep it to myself, I run the risk of returning to my nightmare. We must not neglect those who are still suffering or we too will soon be among them.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF INTERNATIONAL TRUSTEES OF GAMBLERS ANONYMOUS

1. Attend all physical Board of Trustees meetings and answer all mail and quick response board meetings.
2. Be a living example of the precepts of Gamblers Anonymous and personally work the Steps of Recovery and Unity.

3. Uphold the Guidance Code and all decisions made by the Board of Trustees (not fulfilling this affects G.A. as a whole).
4. Attend as many of the various group meetings within your area as possible. Where physical attendance is not possible, keep in regular communication through the mail and/or telephone.
5. Be available to all members and groups in your Trustee area for advice and guidance. Work with trusted servants of groups to correct the issues that do not conform with the Guidance Code and all decisions of the Board of Trustees (not fulfilling this affects G.A. as a whole).
6. Attend Gamblers Anonymous functions such as open meetings, mini-conferences, dinner dances, picnics, etc.
7. Offer assistance to any group that has a problem.
8. Serve actively on committees of the Board of Trustees.
9. Be a Lifeliner and encourage group and membership to support the International Service Office through Lifelines and Group Contributions.
10. Regularly attend Gamblers Anonymous meetings, at least thirty-nine Gamblers Anonymous meeting a year.
11. Make area groups aware of and encourage use of tools of Gamblers Anonymous such as Pressure Group Pamphlets, Group Handbook, Sponsorship Pamphlets, Big Book, Public Relations Material, Ninety Day Plateau, New Member Letter, etc.
12. Attend Regional or Intergroup meetings if they exist in your area.
13. Actively participate in communicating with the Board of Trustees, individual members, group, Intergroup, to obtain agenda items for the Board of Trustees.
14. A Trustee should offer assistance to any member starting a new G.A. group.
15. A Trustee should regularly write his/her area happenings and any other thoughts to the bulletin.

16. Uphold the Board of Trustees responsibility to the Literature Committee and its approved guidelines by:
 - a. being completely familiar, prior to the B.O.T. meetings, with the content of all literature submitted to the B.O.T. for approval;
 - b. making suggestions to the Literature Committee for improvement of said literature, if approved by B.O.T., within 60 days subsequent to Board of Trustees meetings. (Note: Literature proposals from a committee, once passed, are excluded from B.O.T. suggestions.)
17. Bring all upcoming agenda items to the attention of all groups in your area prior to all B.O.T. meetings for input that will guide all the Trustees from your area at all B.O.T. meetings.

From the 2015 New York/Long Island 55 Year Anniversary Weekend Conference...sharing my experience on what makes a G.A. Walk-A-Thon successful.

It is my hope that the steps we took will help you plan a successful walk-a-thon.

Planning

A year before the conference all meetings in the area were encouraged to find volunteers responsible for their meeting's participation in the walk-a-thon. Personal phone calls accomplished this. Each meeting received a flyer attached to a 9 x 12 manila envelope. The heading on the flyer was: *Do You Know G.A. Has Meetings In 57 Countries?* followed by a bulleted list of what the I.S.O. does.

Each week, in addition to the regular collection, the walk-a-thon envelope was passed around (we stressed that this should not take away from the regular collection; spare change was welcomed).

Each month the meeting would send its ongoing collection to a Conference P.O. Box, and each month an updated spreadsheet with all meetings was emailed to each meeting.

Walk-A-Thon Day!

The Walk-A-Thon began Sunday morning at 8:30 AM after breakfast, before the conference closing and lunch. We encouraged everyone to participate. Those who preferred not to walk were enlisted as cheerleaders, water distributors, and boom box players (the theme from *Rocky* created exuberance) along the route. Over 300 walkers participated! It was fun, fun, fun!!!
