A. Office Manager Report – Israel

E. Literature Order Form – Cathy F. and Guy H.

- The suggested changes to the literature form from the last meeting, were reviewed and changes can be made using a different format.
- In the past six months there have only been 45 literature order forms received for purchases. Most sales are done online through the I.S.O. store.

F. B.O.T. Insurance Update – John C.

- John C. obtained the liability insurance for the May 2022 B.O.T. meeting.
- Sunday was added to the policy as well as an extension through Thursday.

- The cost was \$201.00 and was charged to the I.S.O. credit card.

G. Frontier Telephone Update – John C. and Israel

- Due to the office moving, calls have been forwarded from the old office number to the new number and will be on one bill.

A. Standing Rules Proposed Changes – John C.

**RESPONSIBILITIES FOR INTERNATIONAL TRUSTEES
OF GAMBLERS ANONYMOUS**

The following is the listing of responsibilities for International Trustees, as per the green Information Packet booklet that is listed as literature item #28 on the GA approved literature form.

1. Attend all physical Board of Trustees meetings and answer all mail and quick response board meetings.
2. Be a living example of the precepts of Gamblers Anonymous and personally work the Steps of Recovery and Unity.

3. Uphold the Guidance Code, and all decisions made by the Board of Trustees (not fulfilling this affects G.A. as a whole).
4. Attend as many of the various group meetings within your area as possible. Where physical attendance is not possible, keep in regular communication through the mail and/or telephone.
5. Be available to all members and groups in your Trustee area for advice and guidance. Work with the trusted servants to correct the issues that do not conform with the Guidance Code and all decisions of the Board of Trustees (not fulfilling this affects G.A. as a whole).
6. Attend Gamblers Anonymous functions such as open meetings, mini-conferences, dinner dances, picnics, etc.
7. Offer assistance to any group that has a problem.
8. Serve actively on committees on the Board of Trustees.
9. Be a Lifeliner and encourage group and membership to support the International Service Office through Lifelines and Group Contributions.
10. Regularly attend Gamblers Anonymous meetings, at least thirty-nine Gamblers Anonymous meetings a year.
11. Make area groups aware of and encourage use of tools of Gamblers Anonymous such as Pressure Group Pamphlets, Group Handbook, Sponsorship Pamphlets, Big Book, Public Relations Material, Ninety Day Plateau, New Member Letter, etc.
12. Attend Regional or Intergroup meetings if they exist in your area.
13. Actively participate in communicating with the Board of Trustees, individual members, group, Intergroup, to obtain agenda items for the Board of Trustees.
14. A Trustee should offer assistance to any members starting a new G.A. group.
15. A Trustee should regularly write his/her area happenings and any other thoughts to the bulletin.

16. Uphold the Board of Trustees responsibilities to the Literature Committee and its approved guidelines by:
 - a) being completely familiar, prior to the B.O.T. meetings, with the content of all literature submitted to the B.O.T. for approval;
 - b) making suggestions to the Literature Committee for improvement of said literature, if approved by B.O.T., within 30 days subsequent to the B.O.T. meetings. (Note: Literature proposal from a committee, once passed, once passed, are excluded from B.O.T. suggestions.)
17. Bring all upcoming agenda items to the attention of all groups in your area prior to all B.O.T. meetings for input that will guide all the trustees from your area at all B.O.T. meetings.

UNITY PROGRAM

Did you know that the I.S.O. sells a booklet on how to study the Unity Steps? We do! It’s called “Gamblers Anonymous Group Study Book on the Unity Steps.” Each month of 2022, I’ll be listing the Unity Program corresponding step with each month. I’ll be taking information from both this booklet and our red book, A New Beginning. Both of these are available on the Gamblers Anonymous website or order form.

As I entered my first meeting on July 30, 2001, at the Unity Club in Las Vegas, my brain was focused on one thing – to stop gambling. It’s all I cared about for the first few months I was attending meetings. I had no idea what the Unity Program was or why it existed.

As my mind cleared up and I started to understand my surroundings, the Unity Program became less and less confusing for me. I’d like to think it’s the same way for all of us, however, I can only speak of my experience.

It taught me that while I needed to focus on **MY** recovery, I also needed to respect the group as a whole and be one with them as we move forward on this journey of self-discovery and recovery.

Step 5 – Gamblers Anonymous has but one primary purpose – to carry its message to the compulsive gambler who still suffers.

Personal direction and purpose of life are often different for each of us but hopefully we shall remember that the one common bond of responsibility that we share on a group level is to carry the message of hope to the compulsive gambler who still suffers. It should be noted that the suffering compulsive gambler can be sitting next to you at your meeting as well as those who have never heard of Gamblers Anonymous.

Reaching compulsive gamblers is a major goal around which the members of Gamblers Anonymous gather in unity. The perpetuation of the Fellowship depends on the practice of this principle.

The reason for this singleness of purpose is to maximize the efficiency of the Fellowship's efforts to carry its message to suffering compulsive gamblers, in or outside of the Fellowship. The gift of recovery works best when it is shared.

- a. Define/discuss the following words/phrases: "one primary purpose," "to carry its message," and "compulsive gambler who still suffers."
- b. What is the message?
- c. What does it mean to "carry the message"? How do we/I do this?
- d. What is the role of the group in carrying a clear message?
- e. How does sharing my experience, strength, and hope carry the message to those who still suffer?
- f. How can I carry the message to people I don't know?
- g. How was the message carried to me? Elaborate.
- h. What are some of the distractions that will divert us from our primary purpose?
- i. What do we do to welcome back members who have relapsed and have been missing meetings?
- j. Can newcomers find sponsors in our groups? Discuss.

- k. Does someone reach out and call a newcomer or members who have been missing meetings?
- l. Does Unity Step 5 mean I should reach out to gamblers in casinos or bring my friend who I know is a compulsive gambler to a meeting but does not admit to it?
- m. Is it possible that old-timers can be gamblers who still suffer? How do we treat an old-time who is facing difficulties in his or her life?
- n. What can we do to learn from the old-timer? Discuss.
- o. In my home group, how do we focus on abstinence, the steps, page 17, principles, and recovery?
- p. “I am responsible”...When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of Gamblers Anonymous always to be there. How does this apply to Unity Step 5? Elaborate.
- q. There are several principles that may apply to this step. Elaborate on how each of the following applies to Unity Step 5: purpose, responsibility, anonymity.
