STEP 10

Gamblers Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the Gamblers Anonymous name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

If you would have asked me when I first came to Gamblers Anonymous if I had any opinions, I would have answered no. I didn't think I did. However as the time passed I discovered to my disbelief that I was very opinionated. I didn't realize that I had such strong convictions and still do today. How can I have opinions and still be able to practice Unity Step Ten, both in the group meeting and out in the world?

It took many years to understand that it's ok to have opinions. It took more time to understand that there are better ways of sharing those opinions and times it is better if I don't share them either in the group or with others outside the program. I do have an outlet though. I have a sponsor that I can discuss them with and discover just how important or unimportant they are. Do I practice this perfectly? I'd like to think so, however, I believe I have a long way to go even though there has been progress.

Today I understand the importance of the image that we present of Gamblers Anonymous, both to the group and the outside world. Anything that we do or say that will put G.A. in a controversial light will lessen if not destroy the effectiveness of the message that G.A. is to carry to those who suffer from the disease of compulsive gambling. To insure that "my opinion" is consistent with G.A. as a whole, it is my responsibility to be familiar with all the G.A. literature and what is the consensus of G.A. as a whole, or maybe it is better if I don't say anything.

When I first came to the Program, I was angry, angry with everyone and everything, especially I was angry at gambling. If there was no such thing as gambling I wouldn't have ended up this way. As I progressed in the Program I discovered that gambling was but a symptom of a deeper problem. Today I have no opinion on gambling, whether it is good, bad, or whatever. I have the problem and as long as I practice the Program of Gamblers Anonymous to the best of my ability I don't have to worry about placing a bet. Being freed of gambling why would I care either way about it. Now I need only apply those principles in other areas where my opinions get me into trouble.

Our primary purpose is to carry the G.A. message to the compulsive gambler who suffers. Anything that detracts from this, no matter how worthy, can eventually destroy the Fellowship. Where would I be without Gamblers Anonymous? I don't even like the thought.

All the Unity Steps are there for us to practice and live to the best of our ability so not only will G.A. remain there for us, but for the many that will come in desperation to find hope from this dreaded disease. For without them the strong personalities would dominate. These spiritual principles if practiced insure that all are equal and that we will work together in recovery. As I was freely given both the Recovery Program and the Unity Program, so I must freely give, more by example than by mandate. The best I can do is to grow by the practice of these spiritual principles. In our Combo Book it states that diligent effort is required. I am thankful that I was given this opportunity to share my experience, strength and hope.
