STEP 9

Made direct amends to such people whenever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

Working this step was one of the most releasing steps for me. When I completed the last amend I had to make it was like the weight of my past was lifted from my shoulders. At that point the past was no longer such a big part of my today. It allowed me the freedom to go forward with my recovery without having to carry all the baggage from my past.

Making indirect amends was also very important to my 9th Step. These amends were made to people that I either could not find or who had passed away or to those whom it may have been harmful to make the amend to. The common theme I had to use on these amends was the willingness to give both the person and the situation to God. That I didn't know if I was suppose to make a direct amend or not. And if I was to help me find the person. And if I was to make a direct amend to help give me guidance on how to best to do it. That is where working this step closely with my sponsor was very beneficial. To offer the relationship to God for healing, both for myself and the other person. To me just saying “I'm sorry” wasn't always what the amend was about. It was about seeing a painful relationship through the eyes of love, to forgive both myself and the other party.

Direct amends can be fearful, but faith in God, love and the G.A. program got me through some tough ones. And knowing that if I wanted to have a happy, healthy life today it was worth a little pain and discomfort to get there. One of the biggest challenges I had, was making amends to those people I felt did much more harm to me than I did to them. Those ended up being the most rewarding amends I made. They allowed me to do things I could never do in the past. To open up to another person and admit my wrongs and be willing to take responsibility for my actions. To take action to heal old relationships and to improve on the one's in my life today. To me one of the purposes of this step is to learn how to open my spirit up to another person, no matter what our pasts together and feel and act lovingly towards them. To feel the peace that a healed relationship can give. To walk with my head high, knowing I have done the right things to correct wrongs I may have done.

This step to me is ALL about forgiveness. For me it was a big step in my spiritual and emotional growth. By forgiving my past, forgiving my relationships and most importantly, forgiving myself I was able to become free. I thank God that I am allowed to continue working on my amend to myself by continuing to follow the G.A. program in all areas of my life and that I haven't had to make another bet since the day I walked through the doors of G.A. It is also a way to continue making up for past damage I have done to myself and others. To not make a bet today and to try and become the best person I can be on any given day. To do the right things in my life and to be of service to my fellows.
