#### TWELVE STEPS OF UNITY

Unity – Something that is complete within itself, with a oneness of purpose of thought and spirit.

For the compulsive gambler who walks through the door, out of a want and need to stop gambling, and with a desire to become a member of Gamblers Anonymous, it often seems to be a tremendous task simply to stop gambling and restore oneself to a normal way of thinking and living. In the beginning there is an understanding confusion of the mind and the normal impatience. We try to open our minds to share with others who have experienced the first steps of recovery.

The new member often blocks out any discussion of the Unity Program for a period of time, and even those members who have abstained from gambling for longer periods often avoid or put aside the need for discussion and the acceptance of the Unity Program for any number of reasons, but the truth of the matter is the great need for an understanding of the progress of our recovery, made possible by the tools that are available to us as contained in the Steps of Unity.

The Gamblers Anonymous Unity Program is a framework for the well-being of individual groups and the Fellowship as a whole. The Unity Program is outlined in Twelve Steps and is meant to insure the continuity and perpetuity of Gamblers Anonymous.

In order to maintain the Fellowship for present and future members, both individuals and groups follow the proven concepts upon which the Unity Program is based. The essence of this program is in the preservation of common welfare, members understand that what is best for the group is best for each individual.

The Unity Program serves to protect the Fellowship from disruption. Members work together under the principles of unity in order to preserve and perpetuate the opportunity for themselves and other compulsive gamblers to recover and grow within the Fellowship.

#### STEP 7

Every Gamblers Anonymous Group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

In order to maintain the independence of the Fellowship as a whole as well as individual groups, Gamblers Anonymous does not accept outside contributions. This policy is sustained in order that no undue control or influence can be exercised over Gamblers Anonymous, from without or within. By allowing outside contributions both groups and members would be deprived of exercising responsibility over their affairs and their obligation to the Fellowship.

If anyone were to be permitted to contribute to Gamblers Anonymous other than its members, that person might expect the right to voice an opinion as to the manner that we choose to run our Fellowship.

Herb B. walked into G.A. on October 5<sup>th</sup>, 1998 and never placed a bet since. It didn't take Herb very long to understand that service was the main component towards the kind of recovery he wanted, and to say Herb B. was a man of service would be an understatement.

Whether It was to serve coffee, open meetings, fulfill the roles of secretary, treasurer, sponsor and mentor, whether it was to organize and participate in dinners (and Herb never missed a good dinner) or marathons and out of town retreats or to serve on numerous Boards Internationally, as Trustee or Co-Chair, Herb didn't only attend over 35 conferences Internationally (and enjoy a steak and sushi dinner at each and every one of them) Herb spearheaded two International Conferences in Montreal with the help of his brothers and sisters on both the English and the French side. Whatever you needed, Herb was the first one there, no task or job description was ever beneath him. The saying "check

your ego at the door" rang true for Herb as he was the humblest person I have ever known, and he was the perfect example of humility and exemplified recovery.

Herb was a man of tradition and a creature of habit and made no apologies for it. Every year, for the last 10 years, Herb's dear friend and brother, André G., would attend Herb's celebration and pass on his own personal medallion to Herb, a yearly event celebrated by G.A. members and their families. This year would have been Herb's 22<sup>nd</sup> year.

Herbie was the proud father and grandfather to 12 children, 20 grandchildren and 1 great grand-child. A success in his own right, an excellent provider, his children, until the very end, always knew they could count on their father for sage advice, a listening ear, a shoulder to cry and most of all, his unconditional love.

A crossword and puzzle maven, avid reader of books, film buff (Groundhog Day was his favourite), nature and animal lover (we even flew to Omaha just to visit the famed zoo), foodie (did Herbie ever love food?), world traveller, fisherman, corn on the cob fanatic, fan of Billy Joel and classical music, and a hugger like no other, Herb loved life, wanted to consume every minute of it and never tasted an ice cream flavour he didn't like. He was generous enough to give me his last lamb chop, and clever enough to always save room for dessert. He always gave people the benefit of the doubt and saw the good in most.... even in the Alaskan Bush People. He was that good.

Herbie loved G.A. His love for his G.A. family was larger than life. There was nothing that made him happier than knowing a conference was coming up and that he would soon be surrounded by those he adored, his friends and family of G.A. I can say, with 100% certainty, that your love and support these last few months, the daily calls and texts leading up to his last days ... he was touched beyond words and felt surrounded by your love.
