**BOARD OF REGENTS
MEETING OF APRIL 17, 2021**

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. by Tom M., Chair, Board of Regents.

Present: Bob W., Calvin C., Cathy F., Kathie S., Tom M., Wendy B. and Karen H., International Executive Secretary.

Present by Telephone: Gary M., Mazi S., and Richard C.

Tom M. reminded everyone that recording of this meeting is not permitted.

1. A. The minutes of the March 20, 2021 Board of Regents meeting were approved as submitted.

It was noted that the bank sent confirmation that all paperwork was received for the PPP loan, including payback of \$3,865.95, and the file has been closed.

2. OLD BUSINESS

A. LIFELINERS.

There were no Starter Kits sent out for the month of March.

PRISON STARTER KITS SENT: There were no Prison Starter Kit sent.

B. VENMO AND ZELLE DONATIONS.

The I.S.O. received a total of \$1,255.95 via Venmo and Zelle in the month of March.

C. INTERNATIONAL EXECUTIVE SECRETARY RESUMES.

A total of five resumes were received by the deadline of April 14, 2021. Two were from people out of state who were unable to relocate to California. The hiring committee, Bob W., Cathy F., and Wendy B. will review and schedule interviews for the other three resumes received.

D. SPEAKER PHONE FOR B.O.R. MEETING.

Tom M., Chair of the Board of Regents, donated a new speaker phone to the I.S.O.

E. LEASE RENEWAL.

As discussed at the March B.O.R., the I.S.O. office lease is due to renew on January 31, 2022. The lease requires the I.S.O. to give notice to leave between 180 and 270 days before the lease is due. Therefore, in order not to overburden the incoming Board, the current Board has started seeking options. Bob W. stated he has not yet been able to meet with the current landlord about the I.S.O. lease renewal. He will try again before the next meeting. He started making inquiries further east, where pricing may be more affordable. He has been unable to find any areas willing to negotiate pricing at this time.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. REVIEW BOARD OF TRUSTEES AGENDA.

The Board of Regents reviewed the following agenda items for the upcoming May Board of Trustee meeting:

Item 25 – Second vote: To designate the attached Dealing with Abuse and/or Harassment flyer as approved literature.

The B.O.R. discussed that our position has not changed since the first vote. The Board reached out for a legal opinion as discussed in the August 2019 B.O.R. minutes. The guidance given was not to print the information the way it is stated. Therefore, the B.O.R. is opposed to this item.

Item 26 – Second vote: Add the words “Combo Book” to the cover below the words “Gamblers Anonymous” and before the Serenity Prayer.

The B.O.R. is able to accommodate if this passes a second vote.

Item 27 – Discussion item: Add a link to the UK G.A. Website to the I.S.O. Website

The B.O.R. commented that UK G.A. is not part of or associated with Gamblers Anonymous International Service Office.

Item 32 – Discussion item: Is it possible to start making old books available for purchase as a digital download? This would prevent them from disappearing entirely. The more books we have, the better.

The B.O.R. did not understand which books were being discussed or what was meant by disappearing.

Item 33 – Discussion item: Should approved literature sold by I.S.O. in alternative forms, such as large print and audio format be priced at no higher than literature in regular format?

The B.O.R. discussed that this is not a B.O.T. item as B.O.R. sets pricing, based on the cost incurred to produce.

Item 57 – Guidance Code: Change wording referring to gambling.

The item change was not specifically discussed. The B.O.R. did discuss if the new I.E.S. hired is NOT a G.A. member, the Guidance Code will need to be re-written to exclude the wording that they would be “automatically removed from office for gambling by his/her own admission.”

Item 79 – Current Literature: To change the font and the layout of the Combo Book.

The I.E.S. has already requested the printer review the suggested changes. The printer commented that the changes would be considered a redesign. He will get back to the Board with an estimated quote for the change.

Item 105 – “There Is Help” brochure changes.

The B.O.R. briefly discussed that this piece of literature has not been updated since 2006.

B. REVIEW QUARTERLY INVENTORY.

The I.E.S. will email out the inventory to the B.O.R. for review before the May 2021 B.O.R. meeting.

C. REVIEW SHIPPING / POSTAGE COSTS FOR LITERATURE ORDERS.

There was discussion on pricing of shipping literature within the U.S. and internationally. Media Mail was researched before the meeting by the I.E.S. and shared with the Board. That form is to be used only for shipment of books, must go by ground delivery, and potentially will be opened and scrutinized by the USPS. Details showing the actual costs incurred by the I.S.O. versus what was charged to members was prepared by the Office for review by the Board. There is a huge disparity showing the I.S.O. is shipping out at a loss. A motion was made “to increase the shipping costs as listed on the attachment presented, with prices effective May 1, 2021.”

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Once again, I hope this email finds you all well.

In my last email/letter to you in March, I let you know that the Board of Regents had met, and procedures were implemented for hiring a new International Executive Secretary.

After receiving very few resumes, the Hiring Committee recommended the restructure of the I.E.S. and I.S.O. positions. Recommended job descriptions for the I.E.S. and I.S.O. office positions were prepared. A Special Meeting of the Board of Regents was called for, and held on Sunday, May 23, 2021.

New job descriptions, including changing the I.E.S. to a part-time position was discussed and approved. All three current employees have filled the following full-time positions: Israel will be the Office Manager; Jason will be the Assistant Office Manager and Norma will be the Bookkeeper effective July 1, 2021. The only position that has not been filled is the International Executive Secretary.

Therefore, the International Service Office of Gamblers Anonymous is looking for a part-time International Executive Secretary (I.E.S.) to work approximately 24 hours per week.

Attached is a job description with the duties and responsibilities. The ideal candidate will have 12 Step experience.

This position will be allowed to work remotely but will be expected to interact with the staff of the International Service Office as needed.

 - Prepare for B.O.T. Meeting (Spring and Fall)

- Be the Recording Secretary during the Board of Trustees meeting
- Compile all data from the B.O.T. meeting and input Agenda
- Transcribe minutes and send/email to all members of the B.O.T. within 30 days of the Trustee meeting. (Per the Guidance Code)
- Make needed changes received from the B.O.T. to the Minutes prior to inputting in the Life-Line bulletin
- Approximately 60 days after each B.O.T. meeting email the Trustee Website Committee chair with all revisions to the Guidance Code.
- Supply the Board of Trustees with a detailed accounting of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and both Co-Chairmen expenditures within sixty days of the close of the fiscal year (Per the Guidance Code)

TWELVE STEPS

In the previous issues of this year’s Bulletins, I mentioned that Item #50 on the current order form “Gamblers Anonymous Writing The Steps” is a great piece of literature for working each of the 12 Steps of Recovery and that we would be making one of the exercises from each Step for the corresponding month available for your use right here in the Life-Line Bulletin. If you want to complete the other exercises, each booklet can be ordered from the I.S.O. for \$2.75 each plus shipping and handling.

STEP 5:

Admitted to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

Step 5, Preparation Exercise

In Step 4, we made a searching and fearless moral and financial inventory of ourselves. We identified and wrote in detail about our personal strengths and defects. We noticed how those defects created problems, dictated our choices, and formed patterns of destructive and self-destructive behavior throughout our lives, affecting our relationships with our parents, spouses, siblings, children, relatives, teachers, friends, employers, coworkers and, perhaps most importantly, our Higher Power.

Write about:

Have you begun to change your patterns of behavior as a result of Step 4? In what ways?

What has working Step 4 meant to your life?

Step 5 (“Admitted to ourselves and another human being the exact nature of our wrongs”) isn’t about forgetting our wrongs; it’s about putting our guilt over them into proper perspective. Carrying a heavy burden of guilt stops us from moving forward. We need to let go of our guilt and put it in the past so we can focus on our lives today.

Write about:

Have you forgiven yourself for your illness and the damage it caused? Have you come to terms with the true nature of the illness and your powerlessness over it?

Are you still carrying guilt? Are you willing to put it into proper perspective?

Are you willing to admit your defects to another human being, knowing that it’s the first step to letting go of your guilt over the wrongs that resulted from them? Do you feel you deserve to be freed from the guilt? If not, what must you do to allow yourself to feel deserving of being freed from it?

Temporary Guidelines for Video Meetings

- Protocol for entering and staying in video meetings using platforms such as Zoom, WebEx, etc. and video meetings in which members can attend either by video or telephone.
- Attendance only by video
 - In order to enter the meeting, members should first be placed in a “waiting room” if the platform has this type of functionality. The purpose of the waiting room is to quickly determine the identity of the attendees and let them into the meeting either one at a time or en masse. When the waiting room feature is utilized, it is recommended that the meeting consider having at least two facilitators, one to monitor the waiting room and one to facilitate the meeting.
 - If the platform does not have this type of functionality, the meeting secretary or facilitator must assume the duty of identifying all attendees before the meeting begins as well as any attendee who arrives after the meeting has begun.
 - Attendees who are not known to the waiting room facilitator should be further questioned as to the reason for their attendance. If they identify

themselves as compulsive gamblers in need of a meeting or new members, they should be taken at their word and admitted to the meeting. The nature of the meeting (open or closed) will also determine the admission of those other than compulsive gamblers, and the final say on admission will rest with the waiting room facilitator.

- If anyone refuses to identify themselves to the waiting room facilitator, they should immediately be dropped from the waiting room.
- The meeting, through a group conscience, may elect to have all attendees turn their cameras off.
- If #5 above does not occur, attendees should still be given the option of turning off their cameras and appearing on screen as a “placeholder” or avatar.
- Attendees should caption their pictures, “placeholders”, or avatars with their first name and last initial only or any other caption that masks their true identity.
- Virtual backgrounds that may camouflage others who are sharing the member’s meeting space should not be used
- Attendance by telephone
 - Members who wish to attend a video meeting by telephone must be screened using the same methods as above so their identity is known to the waiting room facilitator and/or meeting facilitator.
 - Callers who refuse to identify themselves or whose caller ID is either blocked or shows “anonymous” shall not be allowed to attend.
- Announcements that should be read before each and every meeting (if not included in that meeting’s customary announcements)
 - There will be absolutely no video or audio recording of any kind, including screenshots.
 - Our meeting facilitators have done everything humanly possible to ensure that this is a secure meeting. However, because of the nature of the media we are working with, we cannot guarantee absolute security and thus, anonymity. Therefore, we ask that members not discuss...
 - Any crimes for which they may still be prosecuted
 - Anything of such a sensitive nature that it could potentially harm that member or any other members should that information be surreptitiously recorded and leaked.
 - Members who are especially concerned about their anonymity are invited to turn their cameras off and/or change their screen name.
