B. DISCUSS PLATFORMS REGARDING CONTRIBUTION MODULES. (Tabled from July's Board Meeting).

Tom M. and Bob W. went to Chase Bank regarding using the I.S.O. Chase bank account to receive donations. An email for G.A. member donations was created: Gaisodonation@gmail.com. This email address can be used for Venmo and Zelle one-time donations. This is NOT to replace Lifeliner donations. At this time, there is no plan to track these donations to report in the Bulletin or to send confirmation receipts. To make one-time donations through this email address, G.A. members can download the App(s) or pay through their bank.

Cathy F. reached out to 5 different non-profit entities regarding pay pal and fees. Three of the five did not respond back. The other two used Pay Pal, Venmo and Zelle. Pay Pal does charge fees, but they communicated the fees are minimal and it is better to receive some money less the fees than no money. Pay Pal also tracks sender information. The organizations communicated do send donation letters to people who donate via Pay Pal.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. ANNUAL AUDIT.

Following the requirements of CDC guidelines, (face coverings and social distancing) the Auditors will be coming out to the office to do the annual audit, the end of August or beginning of September.

B. GRATITUDE WEEK.

TWELVE STEPS OF UNITY

Unity – Something that is complete within itself, with a oneness of purpose of thought and spirit.

For the compulsive gambler who walks through the door, out of a want and need to stop gambling, and with a desire to become a member of Gamblers Anonymous, it often seems to be a tremendous task simply to stop gambling and restore oneself to a normal way of thinking and living. In the beginning there is an understanding confusion of the mind and the normal impatience. We try to open our minds to share with others who have experienced the first steps of recovery.

The new member often blocks out any discussion of the Unity Program for a period of time, and even those members who have abstained from gambling for longer periods often avoid or put aside the need for discussion and the acceptance of the Unity Program for any number of reasons, but the truth of the matter is the great need for an understanding of the progress of our recovery, made possible by the tools that are available to us as contained in the Steps of Unity.

The Gamblers Anonymous Unity Program is a framework for the well-being of individual groups and the Fellowship as a whole. The Unity Program is outlined in Twelve Steps and is meant to insure the continuity and perpetuity of Gamblers Anonymous.

In order to maintain the Fellowship for present and future members, both individuals and groups follow the proven concepts upon which the Unity Program is based. The essence of this program is in the preservation of common welfare, members understand that what is best for the group is best for each individual.

The Unity Program serves to protect the Fellowship from disruption. Members work together under the principles of unity in order to preserve and perpetuate the opportunity for themselves and other compulsive gamblers to recover and grow within the Fellowship.

STEP 9

Gamblers Anonymous, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

Gamblers Anonymous is run by the spirit of service and not by the force of vested authority. In order to avoid the problems inherent in the authority, Gamblers Anonymous is not organized in a formal way. The fellowship has no central autonomous leadership. The service boards that have been created have no formal veto power and are responsible to the will of the membership as a whole.

The International Service Office, the Board of Regents and the Board of Trustees have been set up by the membership of Gamblers Anonymous to administer and guide the Fellowship. These groups do not have power within themselves, but they are responsible to each other, and to the entire membership.

At each and every level we assume responsibility, not authority, for there needs to be some way to get the work done.

GROUP NEWS

Dear Karen,

It has come to my attention that Gamblers Anonymous International Service Office is in terrible shape right now financially. Many of you reading this don't realize because of the Covid-19 outbreak, that is International Service Office is not selling as much G.A. Literature, not receiving as many Can, Group, or Intergroup donations. I was informed that I.S.O. took a \$23,000.00 loss in the month of June. We cannot continue this way. It is just a matter of time before we are out of Business.

I hope I do not offend anyone with this letter. I remember about 30 years ago when Bob F. spoke about Lifeliners during a Board of Trustees meeting. He came across real strong to the members who were NOT Lifeliners, I felt so low and disgusted with myself, and ever since that time you might call me the "Poster Boy for Lifeliners".

It is really a shame that out of approximately 25,000 G.A. members, only about 350 members are current Lifeliners. That is not even 2% of our entire Gamblers Anonymous membership. There are 350 G.A. members who contribute approximately \$85,000.00 per year in helping to keep our International Service Office going.

Therefore, the time is right now when each of our G.A. members must step up and become Lifeliners. We should all say, "What can I do for Gamblers Anonymous?" NOT "What can Gamblers Anonymous do for me?"

I ask everyone reading this, if you are not a current Lifeliner, to become a Lifeliner immediately.

Contribute what you can afford!

By contributing \$20.00 per month to Lifeliners each month is so small compared to what we gambled away. I say, to all of you, "How much is your life worth?" We need your help now!

Note From I.S.O.: Below you will find 2 previous submissions from the March and April 2020 LifeLine Bulletins respectfully, that I thought would be beneficial to those who missed reading those issues.

IT'S SOMETIMES HARD TO FIND THE GOOD IN ALL THE TURMOIL

I am writing this on behalf of 9 very dedicated people, who equally participate in this miracle type of event. I'm speaking about the Gamblers Anonymous approved Telephone Conference Call System. Around the 15th of March, it became apparent that most, if not all, G.A. physical meetings were going to be closed due to the Corona virus. It was then that the Telephone Conference Call Committee mobilized to go from 1 meeting on a Wednesday evening to what is now 8 meetings a week. This was done as a stopgap for people to stay connected with the program. So with the best of intentions by the committee to help our brothers and sisters during this challenging time, we have found a fountain of wonders. The calls that come in every day have been from all across the country. The predominant statement from the callers is how they are so grateful to be able to connect with everyone and their therapies. The meetings have been expanded to 2 hours, and still we do not have the ability to allocate time for everyone to speak. We also notice that there are many members who make nearly every meeting during the course of the week. The time for each meeting is 9PM ET every night of the week, but the phone numbers and meeting IDs are different for every meeting. If you are looking for that information, you will find them on page 24 of this issue of the Bulletin.

Ordinarily, I would end with what I have written above, but I will do the Steve Jobs thing - "But wait, there's more."

Although the telephone conference call platform recently celebrated its 6th year of operation, the single meeting that was in place on Wednesday, was viewed upon as just an extra meeting to augment physical meetings. It is only because of the turmoil created by the Corona Virus that there has been a significant uptick in the amount of interest in creating more times for telephone conference call meetings. That led to the additional 6 meetings held at 9PM ET and an additional meeting at 3PM ET on Friday. But it gets better, because a new meeting will be starting Wednesday, April 1st. This one will be the first G.A. approved Spanish speaking meeting. The team of admins that have pulled this new meeting together, have a 2nd such meeting in the works, due for Saturday, but that is not yet official. There are also 3 G.A. approved meetings out of Canada, and a new meeting is being cultivated for Latvia. There are 168 hours in the week. There is still room if people want to start a meeting with any specialty, language is not the only limitation.

Finally, a quick word about why these meetings are not being held on other well-known conference calling platforms - the simple answer is to preserve anonymity. Yes, these hi-tech systems have lots of glitzy features, but everyone who calls those non-G.A. approved meetings are putting their personal information and life in the hands of others. The Telephone Conference Call committee has always and will continue to take all the necessary precautions to protect the members who call into the platform from any breach of personal information, because anonymity is not a choice. It is a mandate of the Gamblers Anonymous program.

The committee will provide updates when any G.A. approved telephone conference call meetings get added to the system.
